Alleluia! Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia!

We are people of the resurrection. In Christ, God did a new thing. Because we are brought to new life in Christ, death has lost its sting. As St. Paul reminds us, "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (1 Corinthians 15:55) Christ's resurrection means that we are free to live for God, for each other, and for our neighbors, free from the worry that we have to earn our way to everlasting life by doing everything in exactly the right way. This freedom brings new life!

Resurrection and Revitalization

A clear sign of resurrection and new life for us has been in the fruits of our revitalization efforts at Bethlehem. We began our revitalization by efforts by focusing on prayer. This has brought to us an energy of renewal. In worship and fellowship activities we have seen both new and old faces.

Life of Faith



The Life of Faith Initiative is our next step in revitalization. This means shifting our focus fully to the church existing to empower the baptized (all of us) for ministry in daily life. When Dr. Craig Nessan was with us in January he gave us a full introduction to this paracign shift. This spring we will be approaching individual members to serve on our Life of Faith Task Force. The task force will receive training and coaching to help us move into this paradigm shift of focusing everything we do at Bethlehem to empowering the ministry of the baptized in daily life.

In worship during this Easter Season, a season of resurrection and new life, starting April 7, we will be exploring the five blessings of baptism. In our baptismal covenant we are called:

to live among God's faithful people, to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth.

Pray and Go

As the weather continues to warm, we will invite people once again to venture out in prayer into the neighborhoods surrounding the church. Praying for our neighbors is a clear act of ministry; helping to live our baptismal charge *to serve all people, following the example of Jesus*. We go in teams of two, praying before we go. You simply walk down the sidewalk, pause in front of each house with a brief prayer, and place a yard marker.



Anniversary Celebration



What a blessing it has been to celebrate One Hundred Years at Bethlehem, Anchored in God's Love, Sailing Into the Future as we move through our 100th year! We began on our 99th anniversary in September celebrating our first 25 years in mission (1924-1949). On January 14 we celebrated our second 25 years (1949-1974) with the help of Rev. Dr. Craig Nessan, child of Bethlehem. JOIN US on Sunday, April 14, as we celebrate our third 25 years (1974-1999) with former pastors, Rev. James A. Schalkhauser and Rev. James R. Lichtenberger. Financial Advice with Purpose

The phrase "Financial Advice with Purpose" is a short, thoughtful slogan used by Thrivent Financial Services. What is so intriguing about this catch phrase is the word "purpose." In God's Word, we discover different purposes for our money.

The first important purpose for our money is to provide for our needs and for those of our families. Money is needed for food, shelter, transportation, and clothing. In the words of the Apostle Paul, "... whoever does not provide for relatives, and especially for family members, has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever" (1 Timothy 5:8). We are to make every attempt to provide for our needs, so we won't be a burden to others. We express God's love by caring and providing for our families.


A second important purpose for our money is to help those in need. In the Gospel of Matthew we read, "*For you always have the poor with you...*" (Matthew 26:11). When Paul started his ministry of sharing the Gospel, he was "*asked... that we remember the poor, which was actually what [he] was eager to do*" (Galatians 2:10). With joy, we should have that same attitude. God wants to use us as channels through whom God works to support those in need. Our help goes beyond the poor to those in any kind of need.

Another important purpose for our money is to extend God's kingdom. God gives us the privilege and responsibility to be participants in God's mission *"to seek and to save the lost"* (Luke 19:10). Our heavenly Father does not want anyone to *"perish, but that all should reach repentance"* (2 Peter 3:9). God wants us to be active, involved, and willing participants in God's plan of salvation for all people. As participants with the Lord, we become God's hands, feet, and mouth. To share the Gospel with all people costs money and that money comes from us. God works though us to fund the mission and ministries that share Jesus' love.

To fulfill our purposes to have the funds for our needs, to help those in need, and to spread the Gospel, we need to be money wise. We are unable to be generous if we are drowning in debt and living paycheck to paycheck. By God's grace, we can live within our means, spend wisely, avoid debt, save diligently, insure adequately, and give freely. One of our money goals should be to live wisely and to share generously. With God's help, we will hear in the end, *"Well done, good and faithful servant, well done"* (Matthew 25:21).


