#### Fall

What we have all experienced this year is as if a switch was flipped on the first day of Fall. It became Fall overnight! One day the temperature was in the eighties, the next in the sixties, and it hasn't warmed back up. We have been blessed with a few days of sunshine, but that is little consolation to those who enjoy the light and warmth of summer. In Ecclesiastes, we read that for everything there is a season (Ecclesiastes 3:1-8). This Fall, for us, is a season of renewal and revitalization. There is much excitement at Bethlehem as we begin to return to pre-pandemic levels of worship attendance. Our building has come alive again with activity as we begin to engage those programs that have been put on hold for 2 ½ years.

#### Revitalization

We don't often think of Fall as a time for new life. It is a time where fields lay fallow and much is stored away for the winter, yet we are experiencing new life at Bethlehem! As of the writing of this newsletter, every assigned time for Prayers for Revitalization throughout the day has been covered by at least one person, and there are now only 23 open slots. That means that 42 people are praying for Bethlehem throughout the day at their assigned times, every day. So many people committed to prayer is the first clear sign of revitalization at Bethlehem. I will also have a a printed version on Sunday mornings for people to sign up in person or by calling the church office.

Prayer is only the first step in revitalization, but it is a requirement for churches wanting to move to a place of greater health as they serve in God's mission. As we continue to revitalize, we are reaching out to members with cards, letters, and phone calls and using the Marks of Discipleship as a catalyst in our mission. And there is so much more that has happened and will be happening as we seek God's will in our revitalization efforts. #### Discovering Discipleship at Bethlehem

We will be offering a study of the Christian faith and the teachings of the Lutheran Church on Saturday, October 22, from 9:30 am to 2:30 pm. This class is a prelude to people joining the church (which is tentatively scheduled for Sunday, November 20). We will be taking a long look at living the Marks of Discipleship (Spiritual Practices), that we hope (and in some ways expect) all our members to live. Saturday will also include lunch provided by our Congregation Council, so this will be an opportunity for potential new members to meet some of the folks in leadership at Bethlehem. #### **Reformation Red**

Reformation Sunday is October 30. We are asking everyone to wear red on that day in honor of all those who have made our faith possible as they stood up to the (at the time) corrupt, Roman church. This day is more of a commemoration than a celebration, as we lament the divisions in Christ's church.

#### All Saints' Sunday

Looking ahead, November 6 is All Saints' Sunday. Family members of those in our congregation who have passed since All Saints' 2021 will be invited to light a candle in remembrance as we ring a chime and recall their baptisms which are now complete in Christ. If you have a loved one who has died since November 1, 2021, who you would like remembered by name in worship, please give their name to the office or directly to me by Wednesday, November 5.

# **Coming Soon: Stewards Living with Purpose**

Our stewardship theme for this year is **Stewards Living with Purpose**. God gives us the wisdom and faith to understand that God is our source and purpose for living. Our stewardship emphasis will help each of us answer the question: "What are you doing with the gifts, abilities, energy, relationships, and resources that God has entrusted to you?" The real issue of stewardship is whether we are managing our blessings and possessions as though they are ours or as though they are God's. The pattern of our lives is shaped by the decisions we make. Satan deceives us into believing that we own what we have and that we need to depend upon our own abilities and resources to meet our needs. Scripture invites us to depend on God and God alone.

In our four-week emphasis, we will focus each week on one of God's purposes for us.

Week One (10/23): "Do All to the Glory of God" "So, whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, <u>do everything for the glory of God</u>" (1 Corinthians 10:31). In all we do, we should strive to give God the glory that God deserves. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we can live lives that seek to please and honor the Lord. As people of faith, our purpose is not to live for ourselves but for Jesus.

Week Two (10/30): "Be My Witnesses" "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). We have a story to tell of Jesus and his love, because Jesus told us, "You will be my witnesses." The word "will" is not a command, but indicates what we will do because of what God has done for us by the mercy of Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit. Through our baptism into Christ's death and resurrection we receive regeneration and new birth by the Holy Spirit. We are to tell of how God has given us new life and purpose.

Week Three (11/13): "Serve One Another" "For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters, only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for self-indulgence, but through love to <u>serve one another</u>" (Galatians 5:13). Left to our own devices, we are selfish, self-centered people who want to do what we desire without interest in serving others. By God's grace, we, as redeemed children of God, want to show our gratitude to God for who God is and what God has done for us through Jesus by serving others.

Week Four (11/20): "Be Generous in Every Way" "You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God" (2 Corinthians 9:11). The Apostle Paul tells us that God will bless us in every way so we can be generous. God will give us both the resources to give and new hearts that desire to give. Through our giving, the recipients of our gifts will thank us for giving, and they will also thank God for giving us loving and giving hearts that make our gifts possible.

May God help us all use our lives and blessings to fulfill the purpose that God has for each of us. (We will not focus on stewardship on 11/6 as it is All Saints Sunday.)

# **Lyons Elementary School Needs Our Help!**

Winter weather will be approaching sooner than we like, and Lyons Elementary School needs our support again this year to help keep the children warm and dry and able to enjoy winter on the playground. Last year members of Bethlehem donated winter outerwear including coats, boots, snow pants, waterproof gloves, and socks to Lyons Elementary (kindergarten through third grade), where many of our local children attend school. The Board of Outreach and the Endowment Fund Committee partnered with me to make this new form of outreach come to life, and we are ready to continue this ministry!

Shari Martinez, secretary of Lyons Elementary, told me recently that they could definitely use help from Bethlehem again this year! She sent me a list of what they need. It is:

- Underwear for both boys and girls, size 4t up through sizes 12 and 15.
- Waterproof gloves or mittens. Preferably not pink or purple.
- Boots, size 13 and sizes 1, 2, and 3. Preferably not pink or purple.
- Snow pants, sizes 5-12. Preferably not pink or purple.

<u>Waterproof</u> is the key for the gloves – cloth ones will be soaked after one recess period, take too long to dry, and don't keep kids' hands warm enough. Underwear and gloves/mittens need to be new. While new is best for the boots and snow pants, gently used will be fine for those items if they are clean and in good shape. Tubs will be placed in the gym for collecting these items. Another organization is collecting socks and coats for the school, so <u>we are not doing</u> socks or coats this year.

During my 32 years teaching elementary school I saw the need for schools to regularly give clean underwear to children in younger grades who had bathroom accidents. I also saw many children shiver through winter and have to stay on the blacktop rather than join their friends on the snowy playground because they were not properly dressed. Winter clothing is expensive, and for families struggling just to pay for rent and food, boots and snow pants get put on the back burner. So, we have a great opportunity to make a real difference in the lives of our local children!

Be on the lookout for donation tubs in the gym sometime during October, along with an update in next month's newsletter. We hope you will consider supporting this project!


