God's purpose for our church, as disciples of Jesus Christ, is to share with all people God's word, love and saving grace.


*We will pursue this purpose by:*

### THE WELCOME AND PROCLAMATION

(The proclamation should be understood as the announcement of the incarnation within human history rather than a literal counting of years.)

☐ *Many ages from the time when God created the heavens and the earth and then formed man and woman in God's own image; long after the great flood, when God made the rainbow shine forth as a sign of the covenant; twenty-one centuries from the time the promise was given to Abraham and Sarah; thirteen centuries after Moses led the people of Israel out of Egypt and Miriam danced in freedom; eleven hundred years from the time of Ruth and the judges; one thousand years from the anointing of David as king, in fulfillment of the times and years and months and days discerned by the prophets; in the one hundred and ninety-fourth Olympiad; the seven hundred and fifty-second year from the foundation of the city of Rome; the forty-second year of the reign of Octavian Augustus; the whole world being at peace, Jesus Christ, eternal God and Son of the eternal Father, desiring to sanctify the world by his most merciful coming, was born of the virgin Mary in Bethlehem of Judea. Be careful not to bend or break the candle; the candle and cup-holder are designed to be reused. After worship, deposit the candle and cup-holder in the baskets at the entrance to the sanctuary.

#### LIGHTING THE CHRIST CANDLE

#### LIGHTING OF THE CANDLES IN THE CONGREGATION

(The pastor lights a candle from the Christ candle.)

*Let this tiny flame represent our Savior's love. Receive its warmth, and let it grow bright in you.*

(The acolytes will light their candles from the Pastor's candle, then the candles of the worshippers will be lighted, beginning with the person nearest the aisle. To light the candle, lower the cup about two inches below the wick. Tip only the unlit candle when lighting your candle from your neighbor's. Hold the candle upright when lit. Lighted candles should not be tipped...avoid candle drippings on the pews or floor. Parents are asked to assist their children.)

**It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Lord God, Heavenly King, we give you thanks and praise upon this holy night when, in your goodness, you showed your supreme love for us by sending forth your only Son, to be born and to save us all from sin.

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

**P** Holy God, Creator of all and Source of life, at the birth of time your word brought light into the world.

In the fullness of time, you sent your Word, born of Mary, to shine in our darkness and to make us your daughters and sons.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Remembering, therefore, his birth and life among us, his death and resurrection, we await his coming again when all things will be restored in him. By your Spirit bless us and this bread and cup, that, held and nourished by you, we may live as your children, shining with the light of your Son.

Through him all glory and honor is yours, Almighty Father, with the Holy Spirit, in your holy Church, both now and forever.

hallowed be thy name,

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

**P** This is the Word made flesh, the very body and blood of him who was born for us.

**G Come to us now, O Lord, in the breaking of bread. As once you were born in a manger in Bethlehem, come to us again in the manger of our hands and hearts. Amen.**

DISTRIBUTION OF THE SACRAMENT

Come, receive the gifts of God's grace in Holy Communion! All baptized Christians are invited to the Lord's table. As Lutherans we believe that the Body and Blood of Christ is truly present in the bread and cup for the forgiveness of our sins. Proceed down the center aisle to the altar rail, as directed by the ushers. If you desire grape juice instead of wine, do not pick up a glass as you come to the communion table.

All are welcome to come to the Lord's Table even if you do not commune. Gluten-free wafers are available; ask for one from a communion server. Children may receive Holy Communion if they have completed a course of instruction about the meaning of the sacrament. Until that time, children are invited to come with their parents and receive a fish cracker which symbolizes the inclusion of the child in God's love and grace.
