The purpose of the Life of Faith initiative is to stir up a culture change that frees us to make the service by the baptized in the arenas of daily life the central focus of the church's mission.

This initiative seeks to intentionally focus congregations on the many and varied forms of service to neighbors through family, workplace, school, local community, and world. Each expression of the church is encouraged to develop approaches and resources in order to make the Life of Faith initiative a vital part of its reason for existence.

Starting in the fall of 2024, Bethlehem will be assigned a Life of Faith Coach to lead us into this paradigm shift. If you are interested in serving on our Life of Faith Task Force who will work with our coach, please see me as soon as possible.

#### **Annual Report**

At the Annual Meeting of the congregation on Sunday, January 21, I began my Pastor's Report by saying that I truly believe that I am wonderfully blessed to serve in God's mission with the people of Bethlehem! My purpose is to master myself as a child of God, serve with heroic love as God gives me the ability, and empower others to do the same.

I will do this at Bethlehem through five areas of emphasis

- 1. Continuing to encourage our celebrations through this 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary year.
- Regular contact and visitation with our members.
- Continue to lay the groundwork for the Life of Faith Initiative here at Bethlehem as we continue our revitalization.
- 4. Preach in an engaging style on the Gospel and the Ministry of the Baptized (the priesthood of all believers as Martin Luther understood it). And,
- Help plan and lead our 2024 National Youth Gathering (Created to Be) to New Orleans, July 16-20, for five of our wonderful youth.

#### Lent

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14, as we begin our Lenten Worship Series - Holy Lament, with worship at 7:30 pm. Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday worship will all be at 7:30 pm on their respective days.

Our **Tuesday** evenings will begin with a potluck for ALL at 6:00 pm, followed by worship at 7:00. The Board of Worship Life has made this change to honor the time commitment of our dedicated volunteers, for whom we are grateful!

#### **Family Growth Resource Center Donations**

On Food Bank Sunday, February 4, canned goods and other non-perishable items and gifts of money can be brought up to the altar in wor-

ship during the "Offering of Gifts". Please wait to come for- food bal ward until instructed by the pastor. This special offering will be used to





feed hungry people in our community through the Food Bank center in our church. Food that is donated will be distributed to the community through the Family Growth Resource Center, using our Food Pantry space. The pantry will be



supplied by our donations and food from the Greater Lansing Food Bank. Monetary gifts will support the Greater Lansing Food Bank and our Mobile Food Distribution.

As part of Child and Family Charities, the Family Growth Resource

Center is also accepting donations of gently used clothes, shoes of ALL sizes, full size toiletries, and small household items (sheets, pillow cases, etc.). If You have items from some Spring cleaning, and you simply can't wait until the Rummage Sale in the fall, just take those items to the Lower Social Hall.

#### **National Youth Gathering Fundraising**

We will be relying on the congregation's support of our fundraising efforts that will begin with a pancake breakfast on Sunday, March 17, after church. We will be accepting a free-will offerings at the door. The youth will also be collecting noisy offerings after the Worship Talk for Children on the Third Sunday of every month beginning in February.

## Life of Faith, Paradigm Change, and the Future

#### Life of Faith

Our life of faith is rooted in the belief that God is always with us, and that we need to listen to what we are being led to do. I always pray that I listen to what God would have us do when I pray for Bethlehem in my position as President. He is always there waiting for us to ask for His direction, and we need to make sure that we remember that. It is easy to get caught up in worry's, and what if's, but that negative energy takes us away from the work that we should joyfully do for the church. 100 years of history here at Bethlehem has seen its share of ups and downs, but our faith and perseverance has shown that there is a greater force for good leading the way. May we continue to look and listen for God's direction as we move into the next century of Bethlehem.

#### **Paradigm Change**

On Saturday, January 13, 2024, Bethlehem was privileged to host Reverand Dr. Craig Nessan for his presentation of the Life of Faith Initiative. Dr. Nessan is a son of Bethlehem who has gone on to be a prolific writer and professor in theology. His insight was a wonderful opportunity to hear from another voice that things are very different for organized churches of all denominations. Our message over the past several years has been that these changes in attendance and involvement in organized religion are not exclusive to Bethlehem. As evidenced by the changes we have seen at Bethlehem, things will not return to the days of yesteryear when the church was overflowing with young families and continued growth. Times are different and we need to be open to the changes that are occurring and do the most we can to maintain vitality at Bethlehem. We are still doing great things at Bethlehem and yes, it is with fewer people, but we are still making a difference. We should gratefully remember and celebrate the history of this church, while understanding that we need to adjust to the changes in the world and continue to do our mission work. Things will not be the same as they were throughout the history of Bethlehem, and we cannot dwell on it because if we do, we will not be able to see the future God has in store for us.





# **BETHLEHEM CHURCH NEWS**

#### Hello all you generous givers,

We just wanted to let you know what is currently happening with your food bank donation money. Each month the congregation gives generously to this fund. For years it was the sole income of our food mission. But recently, it was announced that we were not having to pay for those truck loads of food that are piled in our parking lot to serve hundreds of families in the drive-thru food line. As we understand it, this is a temporary reprieve due to some grant monies received by the Lansing Area Food Bank. We do not know how long this will last so we are holding in reserve your money in the expectation that we will once again be required to pay for some portion or even all of that food we are distributing, which could be hundreds or thousands.

Additionally, for the past few years, that food bank account has generously paid for all of the food we put into Christmas, Easter, and Thanksgiving food baskets that is not donated by you. This years Outreach received \$2,100 which covered all the meat (turkey, ham, chicken, and turkey breast) and dairy (milk, butter, and when we had pie, the cool whip). It paid for fresh produce that we put into the baskets such as carrots and oranges, Sometimes it paid for frozen pies and dinner rolls as well. And finally, it also covered the purchase of extra needed food not donated by the congregation to meet the total items we needed.

The food mission at Bethlehem continues to serve our neighbors and our community in need and is a vital service we have come to be known for. Thank you for your continued support with this mission. Please know that we are committed to using your donations in the most effective manner to best serve those in need now and in the future.
